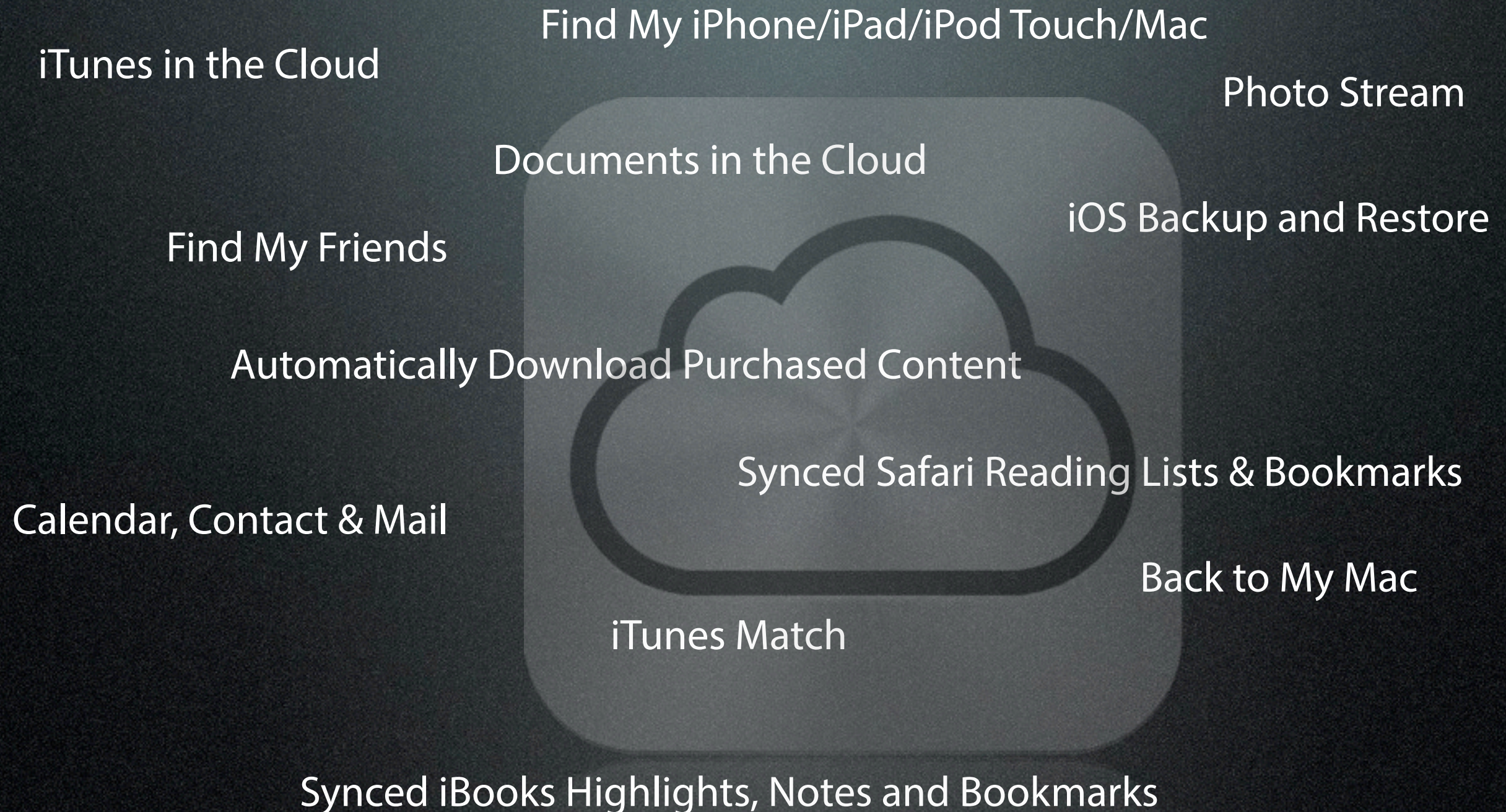

Why are you here?

- To understand what iCloud is and isn't
- To optimize your iCloud experience
- To get the most out of your Macs and iOS Devices
- We're going to give you a quick overview of iCloud's components, then we'll focus on the primary areas of use and concern



What iCloud is:



What iCloud isn't

- It isn't a backup of all your data on your Mac
- No guarantee that purchased products will always be available
- You can't store arbitrary documents
- Not designed for collaboration or communication



What iCloud isn't

- It isn't always dependable
 - Unexpected results - duplicate or missing data
- No syncing with Android or other non-Apple devices
- Security?
 - How secure is any "cloud" vendor?



What iCloud isn't

- Limited syncing with Windows
(only in supported apps)

Best practices

- You need to understand how these pieces work!
- What to do before you start turning things on!
 - Back up your contacts
 - Back up your calendars
- You need to be running current versions of the Mac OS (10.8.2) and iOS (6.0.1)



When things go wrong

- Duplicate or missing contact or calendar data
- Concerns about contact and calendar syncing



iCloud Backup

- iOS Backup
 - iOS devices can back up their data using either wired, wifi syncing or iCloud
- Mac Backup
 - There isn't any in iCloud!



iCloud Backup

- iOS Backup via Wired Sync
 - Technically not iCloud
 - Does not use any of your iCloud storage space
 - iOS backups can be done though iTunes in addition to the iCloud backup
 - Must physically connect to a computer to backup/restore
 - Not automatic!
 - Often requires multiple syncs when restoring



iCloud Backup

- iOS Backup via Wifi Sync
 - Technically not iCloud
 - Same basic features as Wired Syncing, *only* over the wifi network
 - No need to physically connect to a computer
 - Automatically syncs when the following are true:
 - iOS device must be plugged into a power source
 - iTunes must be open on your computer
 - iOS device and computer must be on the same wifi network



iCloud Backup

- iOS iCloud Backup
 - This one actually *is* iCloud backup
 - Able to backup and restore remotely
 - Automatically backs up your data
 - Off-site storage provides added security
 - May consume a significant portion of your free iCloud storage
 - Additional storage may be cheap given the guaranteed security



iCloud Backup

- The following data is backed up:
 - Purchased Content (May not be available in all countries)
 - Photos and videos in the camera roll
 - Device settings
 - Application data and documents (Will vary based on the application)
 - Home screen and app organization
 - Messages (iMessage, SMS and MMS)
 - Ringtones



iCloud Backup

- The following data is not backed up:
 - Applications (You can re-download them)
 - Media files synced from a computer (You can re-sync them)
 - Any large, downloaded application data
(e.g. video or audio files)
(You can re-download them)



Documents in iCloud

- What it does?
 - You can stop working on one device & pick up where you left off on another
 - Files are “backed up” to the cloud

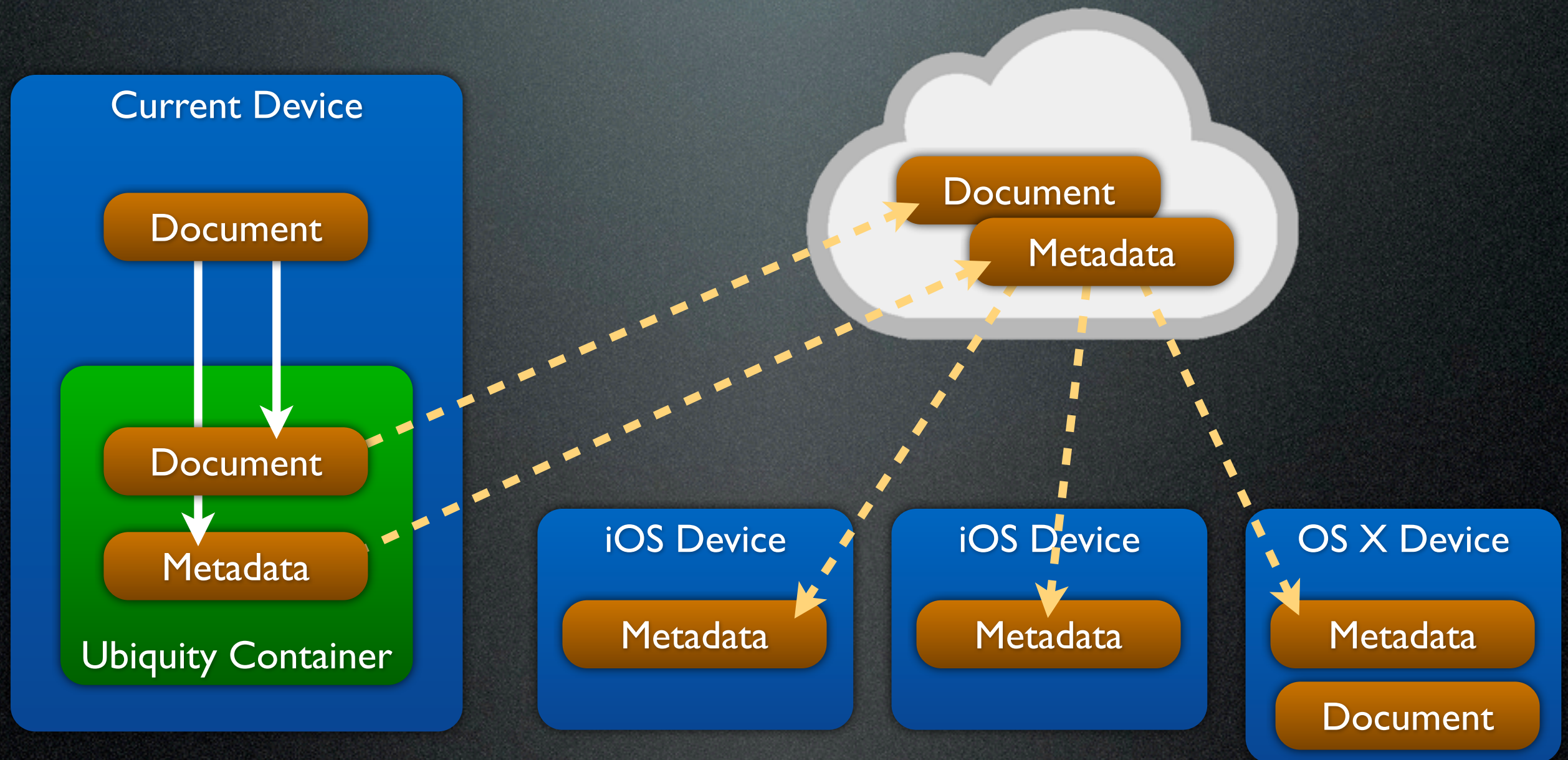


Documents in iCloud

- What it doesn't do
 - Collaborative sharing
 - May not significantly save disk space
 - You're still working on a "local" copy
- Most applications don't yet support iCloud syncing

Documents in iCloud

- OS X always has the latest version of every file
- iOS devices can request to download and use a document
- Always works from a local copy
 - Available when offline
- iOS can automatically delete unused documents to free disk space

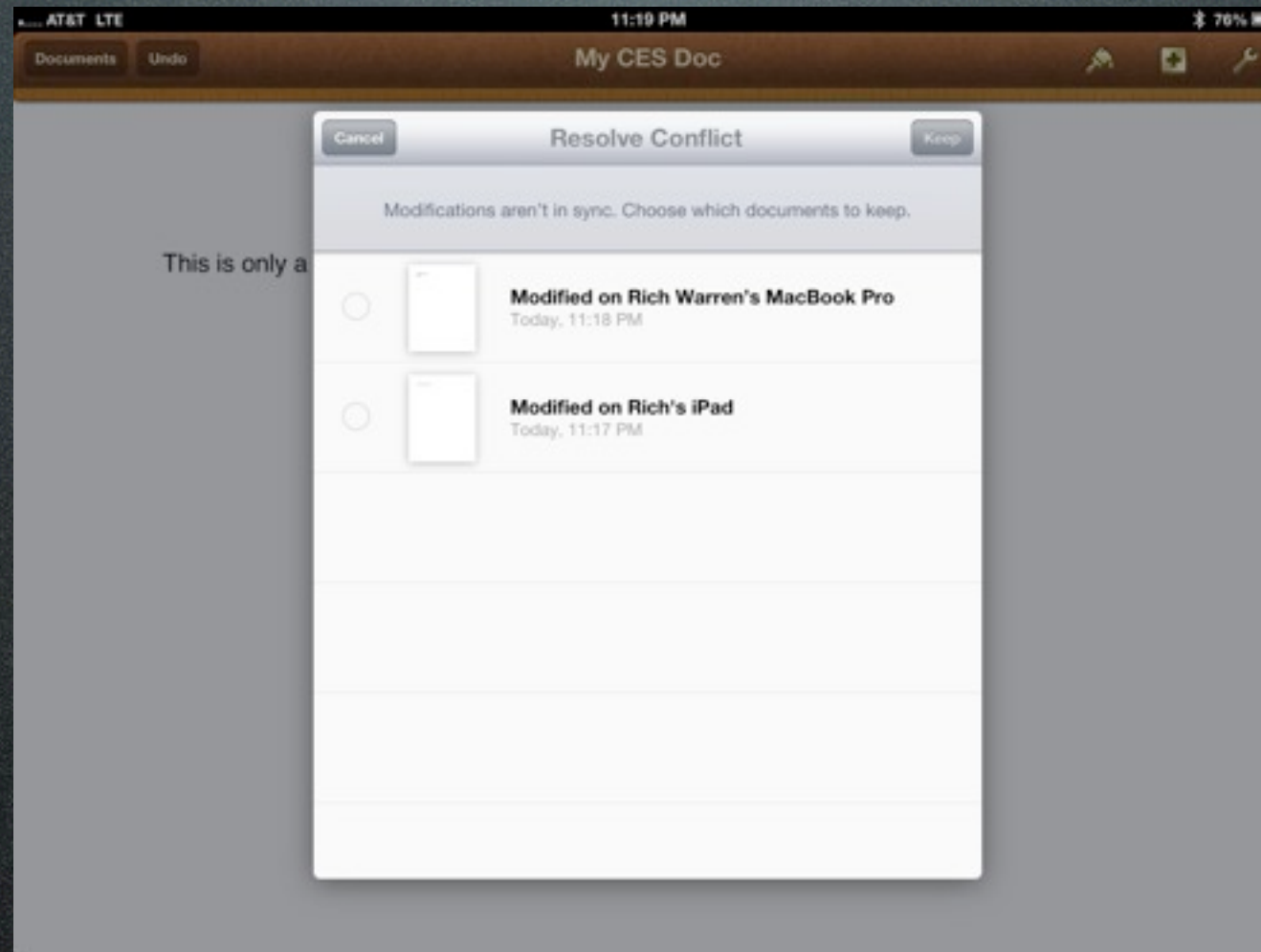


Documents in iCloud

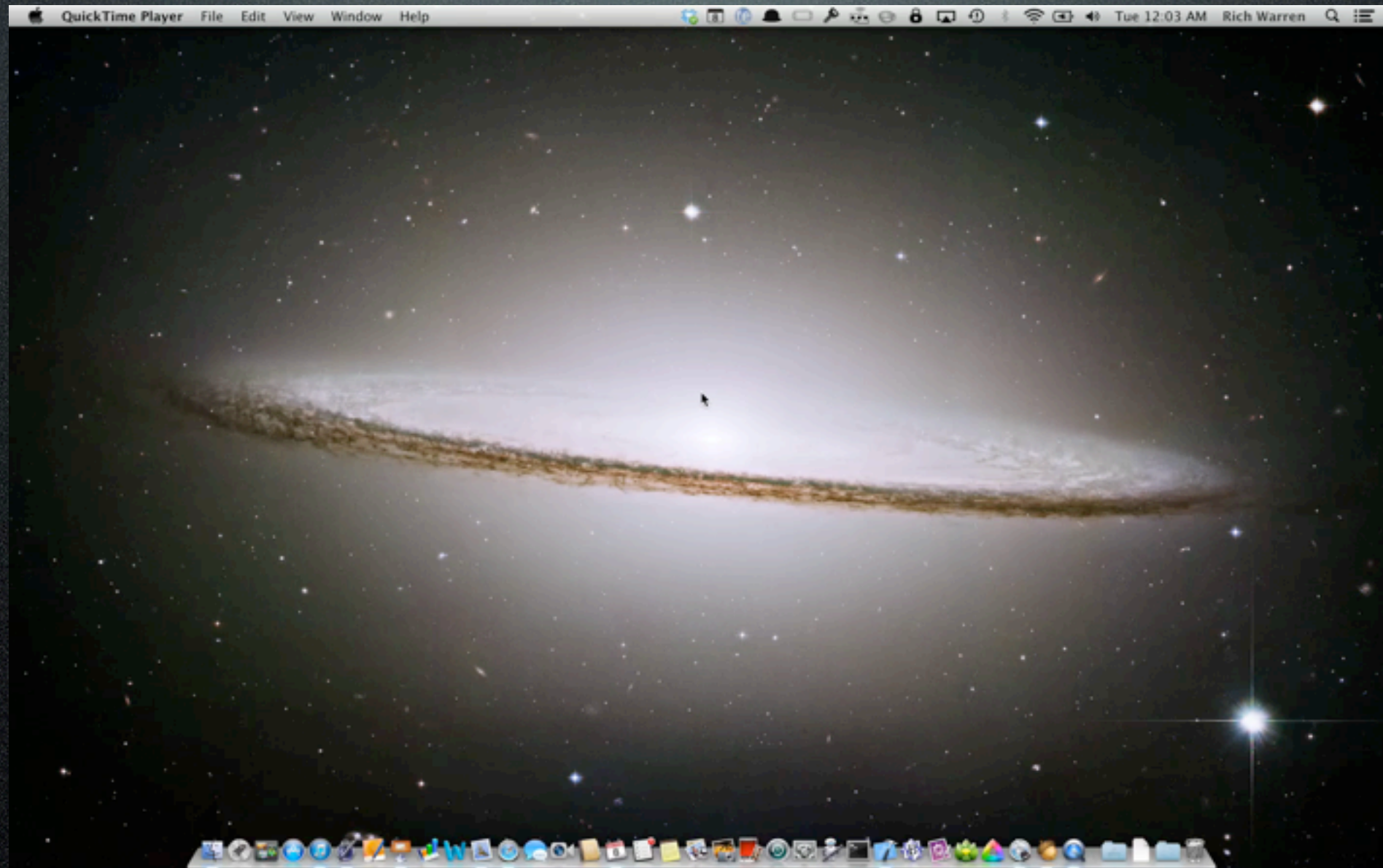
- OS X displays iCloud files in the standard File > Open... window
- Stores everything in
“~/Library/Mobile Documents/”
- Each iOS app decides how (or if) it will display these documents
- Each app can only see its own iCloud directory

Storage in iCloud

- iCloud Storage
 - You get 5GB free for:
 - iOS Device backups
 - Document storage

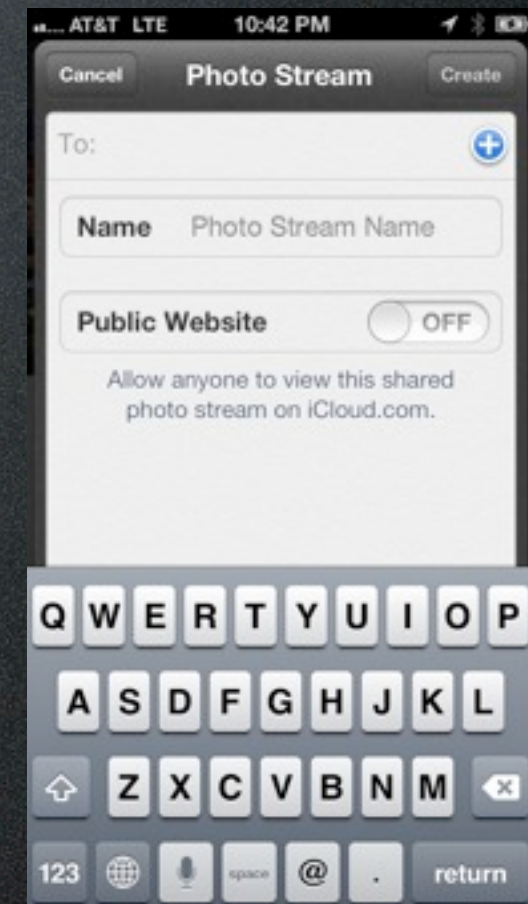
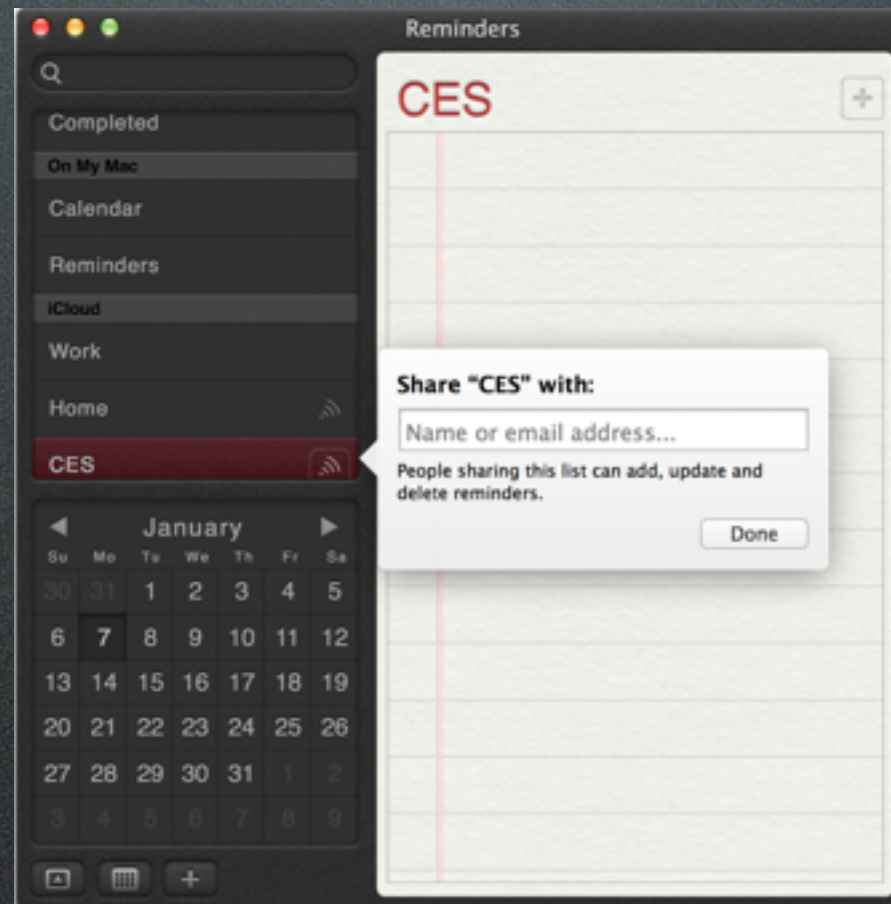


Storage in iCloud

- Additional Storage can be purchased:
 - 10GB - \$20 / year
 - 20GB - \$40 / year
 - 50GB - \$100 / year
 - Aggregates with your 5GB free

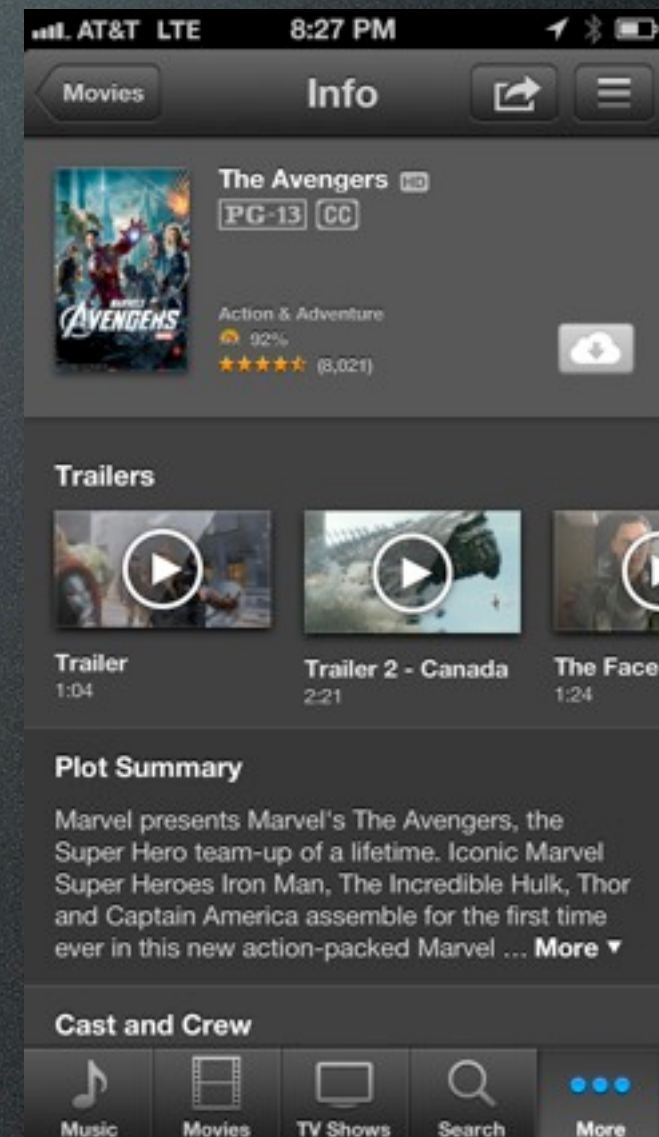


iCloud Sharing



iTunes in the Cloud

- Download purchased music, movies and TV shows
- View/Listen to content while it downloads
- Upload music purchased elsewhere using iTunes Match



Options to iCloud

- Mail, Contacts & Calendars
 - Hosted Kerio
 - Hosted Exchange
 - Google Docs



Options to iCloud

- Document storage/sync
 - DropBox
 - Soonr
 - LogMeIn File Transfer & File Sharing
 - SugarSync
 - SkyDrive
 - Google Drive



Options to iCloud

- Find My iPhone/iPad/iPod Touch/Mac
 - Many MDM solutions
 - Maas360
 - MobileIron
 - Others
- Back to My Mac
 - LogMeIn
 - GoToMyPC
